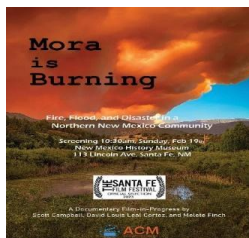

The Coalition for Fire Fund Fairness (CFFF) – a grassroots coalition of victims of the 2022 Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire in Northern New Mexico – today announced that it will host an exclusive screening of the documentary "Mora is Burning," followed by a panel discussion on the aftermath of the fire and FEMA's ongoing failures to administer federal relief funds in accordance with state and federal law.

Grupo Frontera was formed in early 2022, originally performing at weddings and parties. This led them to release their debut EP in March of that year titled, En Vivo, Vol. 1. Their release includes covers of songs such as Vicente Fernández's "Estos Celos" and Diego Verdaguer's "La Ladróna". A month later, they released their second EP, containing a cover of Morat's "No Se Va" which eventually went viral on TikTok and would chart at the end of the year. In December 2022, a second collaboration with Fuerza Regida, after "911 (En Vivo)", titled "Bebé Dame" reached number one on the Billboard Hot Latin Songs charts and peaked at number 25 on Billboard Hot 100, becoming their first top 40 hit

The Destruction of the Amazon, Explained

The Amazon rainforest has been reduced by about 17% since the 1970s. Cattle ranchers, loggers, and farmers are mostly to blame for the deforestation, but the demand driving them comes from all around the world. Brazil's economy depends on agriculture, especially beef and soy, which is grown on cleared land in the Amazon. Today, president Jair Bolsonaro, is weakening the environmental protections there in order to give agriculture more power. This came to a head when, in summer 2019, more than 30,000 wildfires burned in the Amazon, sparking worldwide outrage.

Native American Tribes Land Buybacks Start a Commercial Approach to Social Justice

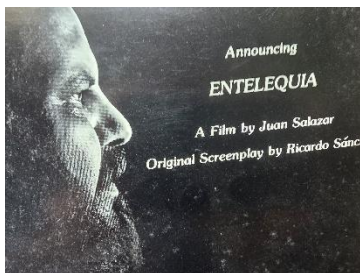

Entelequia

Experimental, tricultural film (20:00)

The first film of its kind, **Entelequia**, is an exploration of the Chicano identity in academia and society through the words of Ricardo Sanchez and experimental film makers Juan and Daniel Salazar. As timely today as it was 45 year ago, the film touches on social issues and the conflicts Chicanos face in a society that denies our indigenous roots, yet stills maintains the racist attitudes and policies designed to relegate us as second class status. **Entelequia** is the first film to utilize three languages: Spanish, English and Calo, to emphasize the cultural differences and class distinctions within the Chicano community. It highlights who we are as

people, trying to exist in a modern world while acknowledging our roots: the conquered and the conquerors , indigenous and European, a people struggling to formulate our own identity rather than to accept an identity imposed upon us.

Entelequia won first place in the World Art and Poetry Festival in Amsterdam in 1980. The film was voted one of the Best Films for the first 10 years at the San Antonio Chicano Film Festival.

Mestizo Magic follows the adventure of a young boy, Johnny, living in the barrio in North Denver. While his teacher drones on about the accomplishments of the Aztecs, he enters a dream world where he meets a Tlaloc, a spirit who serves as a guide in a discovery of art and culture of the Mexica, the mother culture not only of Mesoamerica, but of the entire North American continent. Though experiencing the modern day artists, Johnny is instilled with a sense of pride and love for his ancestral roots. In addition, an explanation of the Aztec calendar gives insight into the highly advanced and complex civilization of the Mexica.

Mestizo Magic was originally purchased by KCET in Los Angeles and broadcast nationally on PBS. It was featured at Canto al Pueblo Art Festival in Tucson.

La Tierra: Last Stand in Costilla County,

Bilingual documentary (30:00)

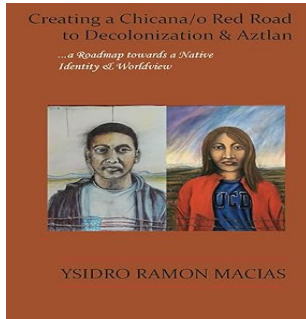
La Tierra highlights the people of the San Luis Valley in Southern Colorado who have lived and respected the land for generations, as their ancestors are the original inhabitants (Apache and Ute) and early Spanish colonizers of this territory. Their way of life, as for all indigenous people, has been threatened by wealthy outsiders buying up hundreds of thousands acres of mountain tract and land grants, which their ancestors have stewarded since time immemorial. Ancestral hunting grounds, fishing locales and pristine forests which have provided means of survival for hundreds of years are in danger of being destroyed by the extraction mentality of those who view Mother Earth as a commodity rather than a homeland which is our duty to protect. Even in 2024, these issues still persist. *La Tierra* was commissioned by PBS as part of the *Life and Death Series*. The film won Best Documentary for the Western Writers Conference in Santa Fe [New Mexico].

The book reveals the Universal and Cosmic Love of the Red Road. The Red Road is the philosophy/worldview/religion of the native Indian tribes/pueblos of North and South America. This worldview promotes integration with Mother Earth and the cosmos to achieve harmony within eternally evolving Existence.

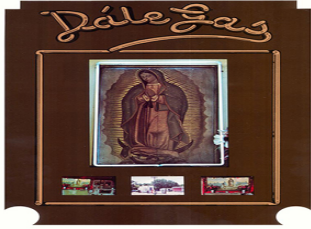
Using the Chicano as an example, the book explores the human lifetime as a cosmic being with eternal cycles of reincarnation and integration. This cosmic journey is examined from the perspective of the Red Road. The book has three goals: 1-introduce the Shoshone/Bannock, Mayan, and Aztec/Mexica Red Roads ; 2- assess the need for decolonization from the European heritage in Mexico and the United States; and 3-provide an outline to create your own Red Road.

On August 20, 1977, the first major museum exhibition of Chicano art in Texas opened to the public at Contemporary Arts Museum Houston (CAMH). *Dále Gas: An Exhibition of Contemporary Chicano Art* brought together the work of thirteen artists: George Truan, Mel Casas, Jose Esquivel, Frank Fajardo, Carmen Lomas Garza, Luis Jiménez, César Augusto Martínez, Amado Peña, Roberto Rios, José Rivera, Joe Bastida Rodriguez, Jesus (Jesse) Treviño, and curator of the exhibition and chief curator of CAMH at the time, Santos Martinez Jr.

Corridos [Chicanos]: Idelfonso "El Ribereno" Martinez

A rare insight, via music performance, is the work of a Mexican-born singer/composer, Idelfonso "El Ribereno" Martinez. It was during his artist-in-residence at Museo Guadalupe Aztlan, Houston, Texas, that he created Chicano-themed corridos of iconic figures, such as Gregorio Cortez, Reies Lopez Tijerina, Lydia Mendoza, and others.

Local Austin, Texas policemen round up a few members, and Paul Hernandez is badly hurt, tragedy that would later cost his life in coming years.

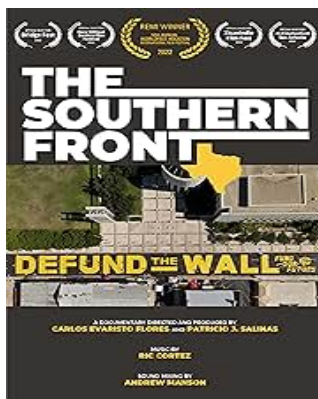
